81st General Convention of the Episcopal Church

The 81st General Convention of the Episcopal Church will meet in Louisville, Kentucky, June 23 - 28, 2024. The Rev. Paul will be attending. For updates throughout the week of General Convention, follow the Diocese of East Carolina's Facebook Page (www.facebook.com/diocc).

The following is an overall description and explanation of the General Convention taken from generalconvention.org. Please visit their website for more details.

The General Convention is the governing body of The Episcopal Church. It meets every three years as a bicameral legislature that includes the House of Deputies and the House of Bishops, which is composed of deputies and bishops from each diocese.

The legislative process of the General Convention is an expression of The Episcopal Church's belief that, under God, the Church is ordered and governed by its people: laity, deacons, priests, and bishops. The General Convention is the Church's highest temporal authority. As such, it has the power to amend



the Constitution and Canons of the Episcopal Church; amend the Book of Common Prayer and authorize other liturgical texts; adopt the budget for the Church; create covenants and official relationships with other branches of the Church; determine requirements for its clergy and other leaders; elect its officers, members of the Executive Council, and certain other groups; delegate responsibilities to the Interim Bodies of The Episcopal Church; and carry out various other responsibilities and authority. The

Executive Council serves as the governing body of The Episcopal Church between sessions of the General Convention, charged specifically with executing the program and policies adopted by the Convention.

During the 2024 General Convention, a new Presiding Bishop will be elected to succeed Presiding Bishop Michael Curry. To see the list of bishops that have been nominated by the Joint Nominating Committee for the Election of the Presiding Bishop, click here.


MUSIC NOTES

SUMMER POP-UP CHOIR! Summer Pop-up choir is an opportunity for anyone to join singing easy music in choir that's fun and quick to learn. We sing on selected ates at the 10 am service. Remaining Pop-up choir dates are: 6/23, 7/7, 7/21, and 8/18.

MUSIC TALKS: SUMMER 2024: Explore new topics, philosophies and ideas about music. This summer, our Director of Music is presenting a series of short talks on select Sunday mornings from 9:15-9:45 am in the Parish House or the Chapel. The talks are approximately 20 minutes, followed by 10 minutes of Q&A. Each presentation integrates new research and ideas that are currently shaping the way we think about music into different topics. The second talk in the series is this Sunday, June 16, and will delve into the realm of philosophy, phenomenology, and musical expression. Factors in how we perceive music and sound and the reasons behind why we interpret music the way we do can help shed light on music's expressive nature and its capability of transforming an experience into one that is sacred.

Questions explored include: How do we experience music as sacred? What about musical expression creates a sacred experience? Can music outside of a sacred space still be perceived as sacred? This talk surveys these questions and others related to phenomenology and the subjective experience of sound and music. A listening experiment via a brief live piano improvisation will function as a case study in this presentation.

Interfaith Refugee Ministry is gearing up for more arrivals, and we would love to have your help. Online Payments Update

As a parish we continue to move forward in the world of Realm to offer web-based solutions in communications and processing online payments. Vanco continues to be the preferred payment processor of Realm.

The use of online payment is a convenience for those who prefer to use their credit card for giving, donations, etc. When using a credit card, there are fees associated. While we prefer that you cover the cost of these fees, it is not required; however, those fees are charged to the Christ Church's Operational Budget if not paid by the individual.

A recent change that Vanco made is that it automatically defaults so that the fee is covered by an individual if you do not uncheck the box when making a one-time payment. Please be aware of this when making online payments.
