IT'S ORGAN TIME!



From the Director of Music:

The day has finally arrived! Our new organ, Opus 85, is set to begin installation in the nave on Monday, June 3rd. I know you all have waited a long time for the new instrument, and I'm here to tell you - get ready to be blown away by its beauty and artistry.

The Taylor & Boody company is one of the most prized organ builders in the world of music. While much of their work is in the United States, they also have instruments in Europe and Japan. Organists from all over the world often travel great distances to play a T&B. When I was at Yale, I had the opportunity to practice and give two of my four graduate recitals on their Opus 55 in Marquand Chapel, which is tuned in mean-tone (a baroque temperament, and very different sounding from any other organ tuning). Their instruments not only sound amazing, with beautiful principal stops, tones, and colors, but they absolutely look amazing! These pipe organs are very much works of arts in themselves, and we get to be the keepers of one of those magnificent artworks.

Now that we're getting to the initial installation period, and in all the flurry of excitement, many folks in church have been asking me questions about the pipe organ. How exactly does it work? What is a stop? How is the Taylor & Boody organ different from other pipe organs?

The presentation will be about 20 minutes long, followed by 10 minutes of Q&A. This will be a very informative talk, accompanied by lots of pictures and maybe even a surprise visit from someone who's very knowledgeable on all things pipe organ!

On the very next day, June 3rd, the builders will arrive, and they'll be needing help bringing in the instrument. Plan to arrive at church at 2 pm, if you'd like to help bring pieces of the instrument into the nave.



VESTRY MEETING RECAP

The vestry of Christ Church met on May 20, 2024.

- Financials Christ Church is still in good financial standing (budget vs expenses 2024 YTD). We have 3 outreach funds now, and their purposes were clarified. Discussed Ann Bustard scholarship expenses.
- Organ update Delivery still scheduled for June 3rd! No Service in Nave June 9th because of organ delivery. Building of Organ will be completed by end of July. Dedicated Service for organ in September 2024, also special guest organist Nathanial Gumbs from Yale will be performing September 20th. Discussed permanent organ concert series in 2025. Organ dedication committee will be assembled.
- Building and Grounds Projects in progress, termite service, Security system and IT/Network upgrades. Future projects to consider: back parking lot resurfacing, cooling tower fence repair, lighting in Sanctuary upgrades, thermostat system and Alarm system upgrades (all properties). Window trim painting also
- B&G wish list was discussed for future projects: possible new furniture and carpets in parish house and carpets in main building; Harrison Center upgrades; tree service; pet stations around lawn perimeter.
- Late June will have a 5th Sunday with service having a Christian formation theme that can tie in with VBS.
- Bishop home for Women will need a working board member replacement from our congregation.
- Cookie Walk will be December 14h 2024; 2025 will be 150th anniversary of Nave after fire.

VBS: Hero Hotline HQ



Pride Month

For half a century, Episcopalians have been working toward a greater understanding and radical inclusion of all God's children. Resolutions from General Convention in 1976 recognized LGBTQ+ people as children of God with an equal claim to the pastoral care of the church and equal protection under the law. In 1994, General Convention amended the church's canons to prohibit discrimination based



on sexual orientation, providing equal access to the rites and worship of the church, including ordination. In 2015, General Convention voted to amend the canons that regulate marriage, permitting any couple the rite of holy matrimony. The Episcopal Church released this newer version of the Episcopal Shield in honor and affirmation of The Episcopal Church's LGBTQ+ members and allies. This version is in addition to the regular shield we typically use. You can read more about it here.

June is known as Pride Month and began as a commemoration of the long and continuing struggle for LGBTQ+ rights in our country. Those successes and struggles continue in faith communities around the world, too. Let us pray for all those whose full humanity as a beloved child of God is not yet recognized by others.

Music Talks

Explore new topics, philosophies and ideas about music. This summer, our Director of Music will present a series of short talks on select Sunday mornings from 9:15-9:45 am in the Parish House or the Chapel at Christ Episcopal Church. The talks are approximately 20 minutes, followed by 10 minutes of Q&A. Each presentation integrates new research and ideas that are currently shaping the way we think about music into different topics such as: time perception and music, concepts of musical ownership, sacred expression through music, meaning in music and hymnody; as well as historical topics such as: the history of public performance, the Bach Passions, and a history of the pipe organ. The Pipe Organ: a brief history of how it's built and why it matters -- Sunday, June 2, 2024

The first talk in the series will encompass the history and mechanics of the pipe organ. Christ Church is excited to welcome its new Opus 85 by Taylor & Boody pipe organ builders to the nave on June 3rd; this topic will be presented on the day before their arrival.

How are pipe organs built? What is a "stop"? How did the pipe organ come to be an instrument associated with sacred music? This talk answers these questions and more. Find out how pipe organs are built and why it matters. Along with historical background, this talk includes points about the workings of different types of pipe organs: tracker, electro-pneumatic, and even digital instruments. The new Opus 85 Taylor & Boody instrument being installed at Christ Church will be the primary case study for this presentation.
