Organ Installation Progress & Upcoming Dedication Events

From Director of Music, Jacqueline Nappi

Opus 85 is now well on its way to completion. The voicing portion of installation is the period of time that seems to take forever. It is during this time that the instrument looks complete, but is in fact not finished!

Voicing is a very tedious process where the builders shape each individual pipe in order to perfect the tone and color so that it matches the character of the stop as well as the whole organ within the acoustics of the nave. Some of the real artistry in the "sound" of the organ is done during the voicing period. This takes 6-8 weeks to complete, and we are right in the thick of it! As the voicers work, they will complete a few stops each week; I'm planning to play and show off those particular stops in church on the Sundays following. The instrument will be considered finished and fully installed once the voicing of the whole organ is 100% complete.

Dedication Events are a traditional part of a new organ installation. Ours will be a two-day event! As the Sacred Sound and Space campaign was grounded in prayer, including in our weekly worship, we will have a Dedicatory Eucharist on Thursday, September 19. The preacher will be the Rev. Will Stanley, Vicar of St. Stephen's, Richmond. The following evening, Friday, September 20, we will have a Dedication Concert. Both events will be held at 7 pm.

For the Dedication Concert, I'm very excited to announce that the solo recitalist is Nathaniel Gumbs! Nathaniel, or Nat, is an absolutely wonderful musician, a concert organist based out of Yale University, and a very well known organist in North Carolina. He performs regularly throughout the state and worked in Charlotte for many years before starting his position at



Yale. Nat's most recent performances include appearances at Duke Chapel and with the Los Angeles Philharmonic. He is currently Director of Chapel Music at Yale University.

Nat and I know each other from Yale, and I am absolutely thrilled that he accepted the invitation to play our Dedication Concert for Opus 85! North Carolinians love Nat, and I'm so excited for everyone to meet and welcome him to Christ Church and to New Bern. Thoughts on the 81st General Convention

The General Convention of the Episcopal Church wrapped up last Friday in Louisville, KY. This was my third General Convention as a deputy for the Diocese of East Carolina. We had great representation from across the diocese. This was the first Convention for four of our ten Deputies and Alternates, and only the second Convention for another Deputy. Each diocese brings four lay and four clergy deputies. East Carolina also brings one clergy and one lay Alternate.

General Convention meets every three years to oversee the governance of The Episcopal Church. When in session, it is the largest bicameral legislative body in the world with around 150 in the House of Bishops and over 800 in the House of Deputies.

We did a lot of work in a short amount of time. I think the top three most significant things we accomplished:

- thrilled that the House of Bishops chose the Rt. Rev. Sean Rowe as our next Presiding Bishop. Bishop Rowe currently serves two dioceses (Northwestern Pennsylvania and Western New York) and has helped those two dioceses imagine how they can do ministry jointly. Bishop Rowe will bring a new energy for doing and being church differently in 21st Century America. I have known him for a long time, including serving on the House of Deputies State of the Church Committee (2018-2022). While the House of Bishops elects, the House of Deputies has the responsibility to confirm that election. I served on the House of Deputies committee for the Confirmation of the Election of the Presiding Bishop along with Tess Judge (All Saints', Southern Shores).
- Recognition of the Navajoland as a Diocese We formally made the Navajo Area Mission a Missionary Diocese (https://ecofnavajoland.org/). What does that mean? It means that they will have more autonomy to do the ministry God has set before them. We started that process at the last General Convention by changing the rules to so they can elect their own Bishop and not have one appointed for them. I am honored to have helped draft that Resolution for the previous General Convention.
- Merger of several Dioceses The three dioceses (Milwaukee, Eau Claire, and Fon du Lac) in the state of Wisconsin were reunified as the Diocese of Wisconsin. The Dioceses of Eastern and Western Michigan were united to create the Diocese of the Great Lakes. In both situations,

the people of those dioceses had been doing a lot of work together the past decade or more. For them to merge made sense as a way to combine their gifts and resources to continue sharing the Gospel where they are!

We also celebrated the 50th anniversary of women's ordinations in the Episcopal Church and took further steps to codify marriage rites for all people. You can see my other thoughts as well as more pictures on my personal Facebook page (https://www.facebook.com/paul.canady/).

Participants of the first Sacred Ground group (who still met online during the COVID lockdown) began working together in Bridging the Gap in the fall of 2021. Bridging the Gap has since spearheaded adult Sunday School programs aimed at increasing awareness of the gap, hence the name, between the predominantly white church and culture to other, often marginalized, churches and cultures throughout history and in our current environment. A sampling of these classes included video series by Joel Goza "America's Unholy Ghosts," and Emannuel Achoo's "Uncomfortable Conversations with a Black Man." Several book studies included "The Church Cracked Open" by The Rev. Cn. Stephanie Spellers. A curriculum from the Diocese of North Carolina and the Pauli Murray Center was used in the most recent Sunday School class this spring. Learning about this amazing person led some parishioners to attend a Sunday worship at St. Titus in Durham, a home church of The Rev. Dr. Murray and her family.

Alumni of the recent Sacred Ground class came together with the first alumni this spring. The increased numbers of participants resulted in re-focusing the scope of their efforts to living into the Biblical mandate of, to paraphrase Micah 6:8, to seek justice, to grant mercy, and to share grace; to plant hope, to sing joy, and to love ourselves and our neighbors.

As the participants of "Living Micah 6:8" gather through the summer months, we seek deeper understanding, undergirded by your prayers, as we listen carefully to where God is leading us. All of Christ Church is welcome to join us as we explore how to live into "...doing justice, loving kindness, and walking humbly with our God.

250th Anniversary Celebration

This summer, the Richard Dobbs Spaight Chapter, DAR, and the New Bern Chapter, SAR, will be hosting a two-day event celebrating the 250th anniversary of the New Bern Resolves / 1st provencial Congress. Conducted in the Craven County Courthouse, this was the first Provincial Congress to be held in America in open defiance of royal authority. The Congress met August 25 - 27, 1774, and is considered one of the most important ocntributions to the American Revolutionary movement.

On August 23, 2024, the DAR, SAR, and Masonic chapters will conduct a grave marking ceremony for five American Revolutionary Patriots, who are buried in the Christ Church yard. The ceremony will be held at the Outdoor Chapel. A new sign will be with the names of these patriots will be dedicated as well. Following the ceremony, the chapters will host a dinner at the Harrison Center.

In addition, on August 24, the 250th Anniversary of the New Bern Resolves will take place at the Tryon Palace South lawn with music from the Palace's Fife and Drum Corp. This special weekent is the kickoff event leading up to America's 250th birthday on July 4, 2026.

Music Talks

The next session in the Music Talks series will take place Sunday, July 14 at 9:15 am. The fourth talk covers the topic of public performance, its history and how it evolved. This interesting topic examines the role of music within historical societies, its relationship with capital, the economy, and its perceived value.

Musicians have been performing in public spaces for a very long time! Who came to performances and were they



good listeners? How did musicians make a living? In what ways did commerce and economic factors impact musicians? Learn about the history and culture behind listening to music at the intersection of capitalism, music performance, and economics. New research will be covered, including case studies of G.F. Handel and Joseph Haydn, European composers who were both financially and musically successful.

On a Saturday in June, DAR and SAR chapter members cleaned the patriot headstones for the gentlemen to be honored in August. The cleaner is non toxic and will work over a period of months.
